Facts about the Landmarks in the U.S.A.

CAPS Ever sat up and wondered about Landmarks in the United States of America? This report will manifest different Human and Physical features in the U.S.A. Did you know there are 50 stars on the American flag because there are 50 states.

Human Features

A human feature is a building or edifice that is man-made. The human features I am going to share with you are The Golden Gate Bridge, The Empire State Building and Mount Rushmore.

SP The Golden Gate Bridge is a suspension in California. The Building altogether costs thirty five million dollars. It took over four years to build, and was opened in April 1937. The Golden Gate Bridge is a mile wide from each side and 227,381 metres high. The number of vehicles that cross it per day is approximately 110,000.

SP The Empire State building is an a hundred and two skyscraper located in fifth avenue, between West 33rd and 34th streets in Midtown Manhattan. Its height is 443m to its tip and has 102 floors. The building was designed by William Lamb. Its construction started in 1930 and took one year and forty five days to produce. Approximately 4 million people visit it each year. It has a big amount of windows which is 6514.

Mount Rushmore is a massive structure carved into Mount Rushmore in Black Hills region of South Dakota. It was completed in 1941 after a whole seventeen years, under the direction of Gutzon Borglum and his son Lincoln. The sculpture is roughly 18 metres of granite. The faces that are carved in it are George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, Theodore Roosevelt and Abraham Lincoln. Mount Rushmore welcomes 2.6 million visitors every year.

Physical Features

Unlike Human features, a physical feature is a feature to do with nature like mountains, rivers, trees and grass. These features are features that naturally come, or as some people say, God has made.

The Mississippi river is the largest and most important river in North America with 5,960 km in length. Furthermore its source is Lake Itasca in Northern Minnesota, USA. Moreover, the name Mississippi comes from Anishinabe people who called the river Misi-zibi which means Great River. It has been a very special route way trade and travel for centuries. In fact the river flows into the Gulf of Mexico. It is also famous for the large steam boats that sail across it.

Mount McKinley is the highest in North America (Alaska). It is very snowy and has five massive glaciers on its slopes, along with many icy falls. Also its height is 6,188 metres and is described as one of the coldest places on Earth! It was officially renamed Denali in 2015 by president Obama (Denali means high one). This name was given to the mountain by the Athabaskan Indians, whose ancestors were some of the first peoples of North

America.

The Grand Canyon is located in the U.S state of Arizona. Many people consider it to be one of the seven wonders of the natural world. The three main types of sedimentary rocks at the Grand Canyon are sandstone, shale (or mudstone) and limestone. At its widest point the Grand Canyon stretches 29 kilometres across, and it is 1800 feet deep. It became a national park in 1909. Did you know you can fly over it in a helicopter?
